

In which genre do you write? Historical Fiction.

Tell us about your creative process. Initially, I would start an outline for a story, but that process quickly went by the wayside once my characters decided on how the story should evolve. 
a foreign country where followers of the Christian faith are condemned to death? No spoilers here; you will have to read the book to find out.


